

EMERGENCY PLAN 2024

This document has been prepared by Baslow and Bubnell Parish Council as a guide to what to do in an emergency. It is to set out the responsibilities and actions to be taken by the Parish Council and its members. Individuals need to prepare their own plans for their own properties.

If an emergency occurs your first action should always be to contact the emergency services by dialling 999.

In an emergency, the emergency services want clear, concise information as soon as possible. Try to use the time available awaiting their response to obtain further information and, if there is any additional information, telephone the emergency services again to update them, as this might affect the resources they deploy

Other agencies can then be notified such as:

- Derbyshire County Council's Emergency Team Emergency planning deals with a range of emergencies such as floods, chemical leaks and gas explosions through to comparatively minor incidents. - Derbyshire Dales District Council

Derbyshire Dales District Council has a service level agreement with Derbyshire County Council to undertake its duties in line with the Civil Contingencies Act 2004. As part of this agreement, a senior emergency planning officer works at Matlock Town Hall part time. Support on other issues such as risk assessment, e.g. hazardous site plans, is also provided by Derbyshire County Council.

The aim of the service is to prepare emergency plans and make arrangements to protect people and the environment in Derbyshire Dales or reduce the impact on them from an emergency.

They liaise on a regular basis with the police, fire and rescue, ambulance and health services in preparing its emergency plans.

Joint training and rehearsals take place with these services and other agencies to ensure that these plans will work.

COMMUNICATION

When a weather warning or emergency occurs, the Parish Council Clerk will receive notification (as may others in the village, for example for flood warnings). The Clerk will disseminate information via the village email group, the village Facebook and the Parish Council WhatsApp. Councillors will share information on the village WhatsApp. The Clerk will work with volunteers in the village to ensure information is shared and help is provided where necessary and possible.

HAZARDS & THREATS IN THE COMMUNITY (Possible Scenarios)

Whilst by their very nature emergencies cannot always be planned for, some of the scenarios which could impact Baslow & Bubnell are as follows:

Pandemic	Entire Village	Support vulnerable – shopping, prescription collection.	
Hostages / gun crime	Entire Village	Support to that area of the village such as counselling. Parish Council communication link.

The District Council will provide sandbags when required to Baslow Sports Field. The County Council are responsible for clearing and gritting highways.

The Parish Council has a supply of grit.

If sand bags are in short supply then a pillowcase/bag filled with soil works just as well.

RECOVERY AFTER AN EMERGENCY

Although most activity by a community in an emergency occurs in support of the emergency services and other agencies that assist in the response, the community also has a role to play in the recovery phase.

It is not possible to define precisely the extent and nature of post-incident community activity, since this will vary with the severity and nature of the emergency. It is likely, however, that community activity will be in one or more of the following categories:

- Looking after the welfare of the emergency services and agency workers e.g. feeding, sleeping, laundry, rest facilities etc.
- Caring for and supporting the on-going needs of those local people affected by the emergency.
- Memorial services, memorials, gardens of remembrance.
- Newsheets, information boards, staffing information points.


The above will be co-ordinated by the local authority.

It is important that the community considers these activities in advance and decides/agrees the need for community involvement and whether a member or section of the community should be tasked with preparing and inserting guidance in this Plan.

APPENDIX 1 - FLOOD MAPS

Baslow and Bubnell is in Flood Zone 3.

Land within flood zone 3 has a high probability of flooding from rivers and the sea. There is a risk of flooding from surface water at this site.



Actions to be taken during a flood: local flood actions
